Communications Team update SOR \$9,000 dollar grant available

Prescription Drug Prevention John Kroneck explained the possible use for SOR funds: sharps boxes, media campaigns including billboards and radio spots for sponsoring an Opioid and Marijuana campaign (examples of graphics can be seen [Here](#)). The question remains; will we be able to insert branding for our collaborative? It may be as easy as sending an example to the OROSC for an approval.

Funding guidelines for the SOR grant (from email: FY20 SOR-OEND Coalition Allocations): "Mid-State Health Network (MSHN) is pleased to announce FY2020 State Opioid Response (SOR) funding allocations for its regional prevention coalitions. Similar to last year, this funding is earmarked for coalitions to use to purchase overdose education (OEND) materials and supplies. A total of \$200,000 in SOR funds was earmarked for coalitions this year; the coalition allocations vary per county and are based on total population size, FY2019 spending, and available funds.

Your total allocation is \$9,000 to support OEND efforts in Montcalm County. This funding can be used on expenses incurred between 10/1/19 and 9/30/20; remaining funds, if applicable, will not be carried over.

Based on community need, OEND/harm reduction items/supplies can include: Medication disposal bags, Medicine lock box/bag, Community-based medication disposal boxes, Needle clean-up kit supplies (inc. sharps containers, puncture-resistant gloves, tongs, safety glasses), OEND-related marketing materials (e.g., to promote overdose education, naloxone distribution hubs/availability, harm reduction sites, Hidden in Plain Sight drug education trailer, and OEND trainings and naloxone distribution/marketing. Additional OEND-related items and/or projects may also be approved on a case-by-case basis; please email me with your ideas for consideration. *NOTE: MSHN has separate funds for naloxone kits, so if your community needs kits, please let me know.*

This year, instead of submitting a single invoice, you will report expenses in a separate SOR FSR by the 10th of each month for reimbursement. Expenses can be backdated to 10/1/19, if eligible (please let me know if you have questions). Reports will be due monthly, midyear, and annually; please see monthly report template for more info. A letter of agreement (LOA) will be sent separately from Kyle in our contracts department.”
